

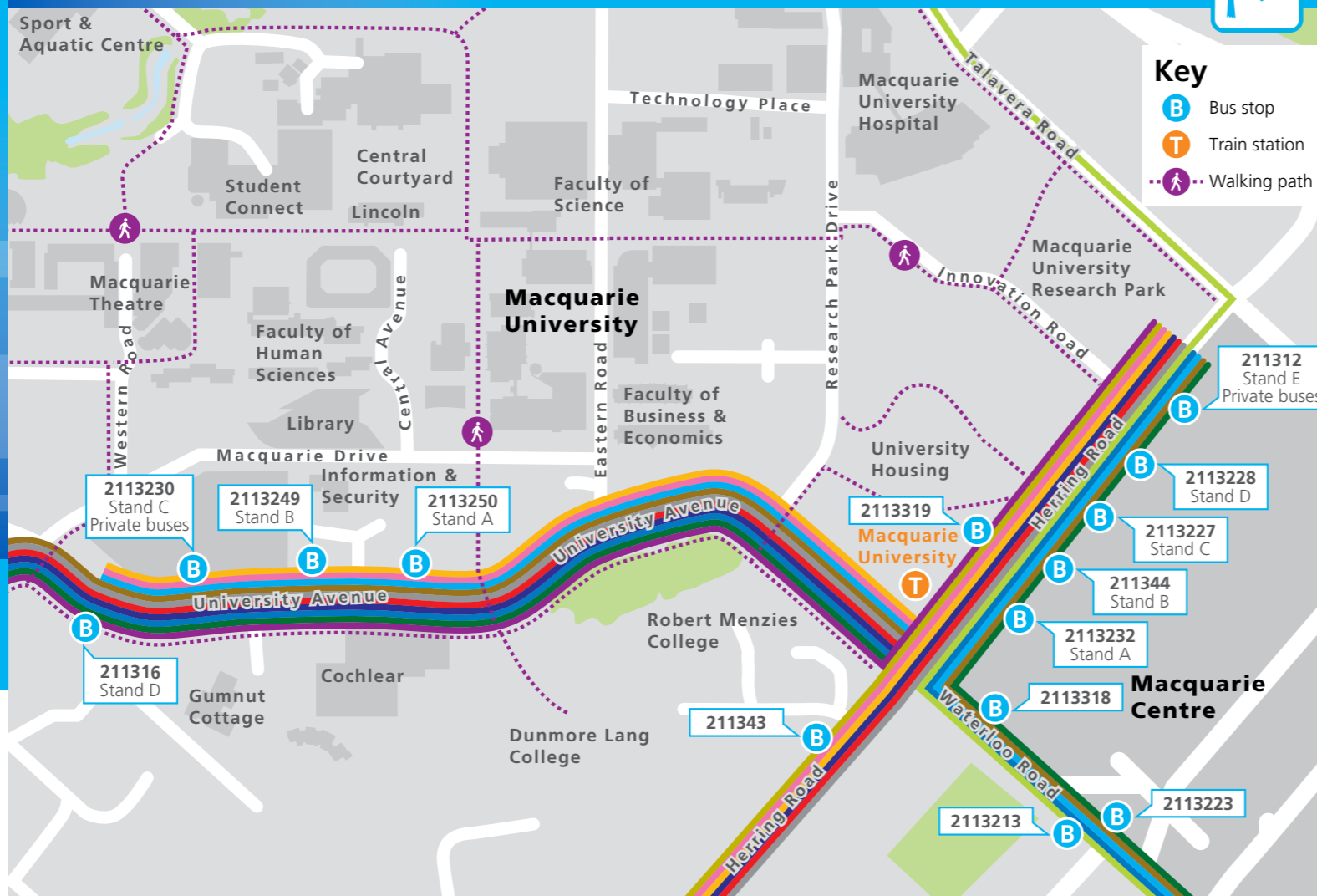


# Getting to Macquarie University with State Transit

## Attractions and entertainment

State Transit's network of buses can get you to the main attractions and places of interest in Sydney. Here's a sample of attractions that can be accessed directly from Macquarie.

**Macquarie Centre**  
A short walk from the university campus, Macquarie Centre offers an expansive dining and entertainment precinct featuring cinemas and ice skating. The bus interchange and train station are situated right next door.

**Parramatta**  
The second largest CBD in New South Wales, Parramatta is undergoing a huge transformation confirming its spot as a lively city, a hub of dining, shopping, commerce and entertainment.

- Church and Phillip streets form the **Eat Street Dining Precinct**, with a wide variety of restaurants, cafés and bars open seven days a week, well into the evening.
- The **Parramatta River** winds its way through the CBD and surrounding suburbs. The popular ferry service departing Parramatta Wharf in Charles Street travels along the river to the inner western suburbs, Darling Harbour and Circular Quay.
- **Parramatta Park**, 85 hectares of parkland surrounding the River, features walking paths, a café and a number of historic landmarks.
- **Pirtek Stadium** – home to the Parramatta Eels and the Western Sydney Wanderers – is also a short walk from the CBD.
- **Riverside Theatres** is located on the banks of the River next to the Eat Street Dining Precinct, with over 700 performances and events taking place every year.

**Top Ryde City**  
A large centre offering alfresco dining and cinemas, as well as major stores, supermarkets, specialty stores and services.

**Sydney City**  
The City has it all, from entertainment experiences, dining, shopping, the arts, cinemas and our famous harbour. The core of the city is situated around Museum, St James and Town Hall stations. Other attractions including The Rocks, the Opera House, ferries and the harbour are located near Circular Quay.

## Shopping

There are also frequent services to main shopping centres, linking directly from Macquarie.

**Macquarie Centre**  
Recently expanded, Macquarie Centre features hundreds of stores and international retailers in addition to the dining and entertainment precinct. Access is a 10 minute walk from the university, or just one bus stop away.

**Parramatta**  
Parramatta offers one of the largest Westfield centres in Sydney, while surrounding streets feature a wide range of specialty stores, restaurants and services.

**Top Ryde City**  
Major stores, supermarkets, specialty stores and services are on offer, as well as cinemas and outdoor dining.

**Carlingford Court**  
For supermarkets, specialty stores and essential services, catch Route m54 right to the door.

**Chatswood**  
Chatswood offers hundreds of shops, restaurants, cinemas and entertainment. Major shopping centres include Chatswood Chase and Westfield Chatswood, and surrounding streets feature many international restaurants, specialty shops and services.

**Rhodes Waterside**  
Featuring cinemas, shopping and IKEA, Rhodes Waterside has also recently introduced an outdoor dining and restaurant precinct. Catch routes m41 or 459 and alight at Rhodes Station – it's a ten minute walk from the bus stop to the centre.

**Burwood**  
Burwood offers a variety of shops, restaurants, entertainment and cinemas located in the Westfield Burwood shopping centre and surrounding streets.

## Accessibility

Most State Transit buses are wheelchair-accessible with low-level floors and space for wheelchairs, prams or strollers.

To help you work out the right stop to leave your bus, most buses on routes m41 and m54 also feature automatic announcements and display screens, broadcasting details of bus stops, attractions and transport connections.

## Customer comfort

Eating, drinking, smoking or playing loud music on the bus is not allowed. By law, smoking is not allowed at any bus stop, or at train stations, ferry wharves or light rail stops.

Opal is the easy way of travelling on public transport in Sydney, the Blue Mountains, Central Coast, Hunter, Illawarra and Southern Highlands.

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- Fares capped daily and weekly

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## Services

Macquarie is serviced by buses operating from Parramatta, Ryde, the inner west, north shore and surrounding suburbs and transport interchanges. Most services start early in the morning and operate frequently until late in the evening, seven days a week.

The maps above and overleaf can help identify the best service for you, and the closest stop where you can catch it.

In addition to buses, Sydney Trains' T1 Northern Line services stop at Macquarie University Station, connecting the campus with the north shore, Sydney CBD, the western suburbs and Hornsby.

**Bus stop locations**  
Most services arrive and depart from bus stops in University Avenue, in the grounds of the university campus.

There are additional stops and bus services at Macquarie Centre, a ten minute walk from the centre of the campus. You can also access Macquarie University train station from here.
